

Tools for Humanity Cookie Policy

This Cookie Policy explains how we, Tools for Humanity Corporation and its affiliates (collectively “we”, “our”, “us”, or “TFH”), use cookies and similar technologies, like web beacons, to track the online movement of our users when they visit our websites and other Services. A web beacon is a technique used on web pages to unobtrusively (usually invisibly) allow checking that a user has accessed some content. This Cookie Policy is incorporated into and subject to the Tools for Humanity Privacy Notice.

Depending on which of our websites you are visiting, we are using different cookies. We apply techniques of pseudonymisation to all cookies to ensure users’ privacy.

We use the following types of cookies:

Strictly Necessary Cookies: These cookies are necessary for the Services to function and cannot be switched off in our systems. They are usually only set in response to actions made by you that amount to a request for services, such as logging in or filling in forms. These also include cookies we may rely on for fraud prevention. You can set your browser to block or alert you about these cookies, but some of the Services may not work. The legal basis for using Strictly Necessary Cookies is legitimate interest. The legitimate interest pursued is providing free information online to people who freely decide to visit that website which would not work without Strictly Necessary Cookies.

Performance/Analytics Cookies: These cookies allow us to count visits and traffic sources so we can measure and improve the performance of our Services. They help us understand page popularity and visitors’ movement around the Services. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and is therefore anonymous. If you do not allow these cookies, we will not know when you have used our Services and will not be able to monitor performance. The legal basis for using Performance/Analytics Cookies is the user’s consent. Your consent can be freely withdrawn at any time.

Functionality Cookies: These cookies allow us to remember the choices you make and to tailor our Services so we can provide relevant content to you. For example, a functionality cookie can remember your preferences (e.g., country or language selection), or your username. The legal basis for using Functionality Cookies is the user’s consent. Your consent can be freely withdrawn at any time.

Here is a list of the cookies we use for different parts of the website:

toolsforhumanity.com	On the toolsforhumanity.com website we are using Strictly Necessary Cookies and optional Performance/ Analytics Cookies (one cookie of each category). We only use analytics to improve our product. We do not use your data to sell it for third parties’ advertising.

We and our third-party service providers employ web beacons for the reasons stated below, but primarily to help us better manage content on our Services by informing us which content is effective.

Together, these tools allow us to:

- Perform website analytics;
- Prevent fraud and prevent attacks against our websites and Services; and

We use cookies and trackers to assign you a unique identifier so we can record:

- Websites you visit
- Your IP Address

You can block cookies at any time using your web browser settings, but doing so may limit your browsing experience and your ability to use certain features of the Services.

How long will cookies stay on my browsing device?

The length of time a cookie will stay on your browsing device depends on whether it is a "persistent" or "session" cookie. Session cookies will only stay on your device until you close your browser. Persistent cookies stay on your browsing device until they expire or are deleted.

How to manage cookies and similar technologies

You have the right to decide whether to accept cookies that are not Strictly Necessary Cookies.

You can also choose how cookies (across all websites) are handled on your device via your browser settings including blocking or deleting all cookies or just third-party cookies. Each browser manufacturer is different, so check the "Help" menu of your browser to learn how to change your cookie preferences.

Do Not Track: Some Internet browsers - like Internet Explorer, Firefox, and Safari - include the ability to transmit "Do Not Track" or "DNT" signals. Since uniform standards for "DNT" signals have not been adopted, our Sites do not currently process or respond to "DNT" signals.
